	Funding may be requested for projects in basic research that are clearly defined, innovative, with plausibly described objectives and methods, and are limited in duration (see FWF Application Guidelines section 1.2).	
Eligible Costs	The FWF generally does not have any minimum limit. The maximum limit per project submitted to the FWF in this call is 400,000 EUR. Projects that exceed the maximum limit will not be eligible. This limit includes the annual valorization of personnel costs as well as 5% general project costs (calculated automatically in the cost breakdown in Elane). The budget specified in the national submission must correspond to this consortium partner's budget submitted to the EP and be calculated on the basis of the applicable FWF personnel cost rates at the time of submission in both the pre-proposal and full proposal stages. Minor deviations resulting from updated FWF personnel cost rates between stages are permissible.	

	To ensure consistency, project costs should be calculated at Elane (FWF) prior to inclusion in the consortium proposal. The FWF does not cover overhead costs. General project costs (calculated automatically in the cost breakdown in Elane) may be declared as “overheads” in the EP budget forms. In addition, funding may be requested for project-specific work at the associated research partner’s institution (if already registered in the FWF’s research institution portal). Associated research partners are researchers working on a project-specific basis at other Austrian research institutions (associated research institutions) and who are making a significant scientific/scholarly contribution to the project. Eligible Costs	○ The FWO has allocated a budget of 700,000 EUR, which guarantees funding for at least two projects. ○ The respective funding channel regulations apply (see the links to the national rules above, under ‘Eligible Institutions’), and both are capped at 350,000 EUR per project/consortium (including overhead, for which the calculation method differs per funding channel – see explanation below).	

	- For the overhead calculation, fundamental research projects (FO) and strategic basic research projects (SBO) use the same approach. A structural overhead rate should be applied to the project costs, with an overhead rate of 6% for 'FO projects' and 17% for 'SBO projects'. Some practical examples: ➤ <u>FO: if the sum of all costs (personnel, consumables, travel, subcontracting, etc.) amounts to 200,000 EUR, the overhead will amount to 12,000 EUR (6% of 200,000 EUR), and the total requested cost will be 212,000 EUR. This total requested cost may never exceed the maximum available amount of 350,000 EUR.</u> ➤ <u>SBO: if the sum of all costs (personnel, consumables, travel, subcontracting, etc.) amounts to 200,000 EUR, the overhead will amount to 34,000 EUR (17% of 200,000 EUR), and the total requested cost will be 234,000 EUR. This total requested cost may never exceed the maximum available amount of 350,000 EUR.</u> Overhead should be included in the Water4All budget tables, but should <u>not</u> be included in the national/regional FWO pre-registration form on the FWO E-loket (see below under 'Other Funding Criteria').

IMPORTANT !! - Applicants for FWO funding must submit a mandatory administrative application via the personal FWO E-loket of the main PI from Flanders. ➤ For fundamental research projects (FO) select the application type: 'Research projects – European programme fundamental research'. ➤ For strategic basic research projects (SBO), select the application type: 'Research projects – European programme strategic basic research'. If the consortium includes more than one partner requesting funding from FWO, a <u>single online form</u> should be submitted by the main PI (promoter-spokesperson), containing all relevant information for the different Flemish partners. The deadline to submit this administrative application to the FWO is identical to the deadline of the joint transnational call (pre-proposal stage). To ensure the eligibility of the proposal, it is recommended to consult the FWO administration at least one week in advance. <u>Failure to comply with these requirements may result in ineligibility.</u> - Participation in this call does not interfere with the regular/national project submission framework and is therefore not taken into account when calculating the maximum permitted number of new applications and ongoing projects combined. However, researchers can only participate in two different international consortia in this call as partners, or in only one project if they take up the role of coordinator. - Projects aiming at the development of a spin-off company are not eligible in this context. A potential 'spin-off route' should therefore not be mentioned in the FWO pre-registration form. - The project duration is limited to 36 months, which implies that the funding must be budgeted and spent accordingly. 	the FWO Research Projects and Article 14 of the Strategic Basic Research (SBO) regulations do not apply here. ○ The PI of each participating institution applying for FWO funds must hold an <u>eligible</u> appointment that fully covers the duration of the research project. In connection with the above, Article 10, §7 of the FWO Research Projects regulations (FO) does not apply to this call. This means that supervisors/spokespersons or coordinators/consortium partners who are granted emeritus status during the calendar year in which the project application is submitted, or during the project execution period, are not eligible.

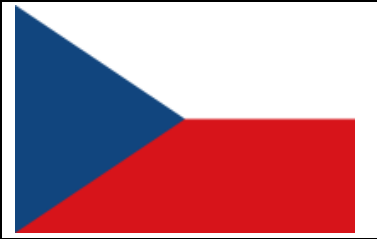

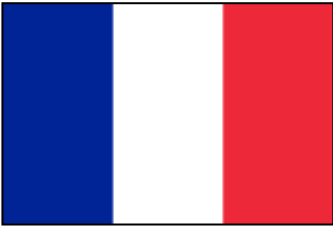

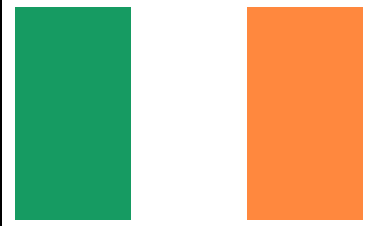
