### Resumen de la Memoria:

I have a broad academic interest in moral philosophy and applied ethics, but I have gained expertise and international recognition in the bioethics subfields of transplant ethics and end-of-life decision making. My research about death determination in the context of organ procurement has been published in leading European and North American journals of medicine and bioethics. Despite my primary focus on clinical bioethics, I am increasingly exploring bioethical domains related to global health ethics. Since 2012, I collaborate with the organization Academics Stand Against Poverty in several projects intended to decrease extreme poverty and global health inequality.

My contributions to the field are genuinely interdisciplinary and empirically oriented, which accounts for the interest it has created in both philosophical and medical audiences.

I enjoy working with colleagues from the health sciences. Few of my career achievements would have been possible without the opportunities I had to build and maintain ongoing collaborations with colleagues from these disciplines, from Europe, Canada and the United States.

### Resumen del Currículum Vitae:

I'm a Juan de la Cierva postdoctoral researcher at the Philosophy Institute of the Spanish National Research Council (IFS, CCHS-CSIC), and belong to the Group or Excellence G-41 on Applied Ethics of the University of Salamanca. I hold a PhD in Moral Philosophy and a PhD in Medical Ethics. I have been a visiting fellow at the Hastings Center, at Case Western Reserve University Department of Bioethics, at University of Toronto Joint Center for Bioethics, and visiting professor at the Paris-Descartes University.

Teoría de la literatura y filosofía hoy: aspectos fronterizos

**Resumen de la Memoria:**

The interdisciplinary training I received is on the basis of the two principal research lines I have been developing. The principal, about actuality of Literature and Philosophy relations, which I am going to expose here, and a secondary but constant, about comparative literature studies. Theory of literature and Philosophy today: border aspects

1. Literature and philosophy in the linguistic turn (1940-1980). My thesis is that philosophical language would find its ability and creative power, experimenter, in a language that usually had been associated with the literary language. The twentieth century recovers, thus, for the rhetoric its original performative powers, which linked it, as a condition of possibility, to democracy itself. As Nietzsche wrote "eloquence is republican." Remember, finally, with Ricoeur that rhetoric, in its origin, was proposed to regulate all the uses of the public word, "the word was a weapon designed to influence the people, before court, in the public assembly, also a weapon for the praise and panegyric ". This conclusion opens the second phase of my research line as a hinge.

This has been the context of my doctoral dissertation and other works about Michel Foucault, my book about woman poetry thought (Instant, contradiction. Poetry as knowledge and experience, Genil, 2007). And mainly of my postdoctoral research project ♦Manierismo y escritura. Hacia una arqueología de las formas de autorrepresentación del lenguaje o la escritura como acontecimiento (del arte como representación a la ontología de la literatura♦ (2007-2009), within I publish, among others, the very important publication ♦Razón y Sinrazón en el Licenciado Vidriera, El casamiento engañoso y el Coloquio de los perros♦ (Confluencia, 2013). On the specific problematic of ontology of literature, I developed four highlighting works: ♦Ontología y literatura en Michel Foucault♦ (2007), ♦Thomas I♦obscuro, o hacia una nueva experiencia de la lectura♦ (2009), another, result of my research stay in the Iberoamerikanisches Institute of Berlin: ♦La biblioteca y el ser del lenguaje en Borges y Foucault♦, and "La hermenéutica de Michel Foucault" (2014).

2. Literature and philosophy in the political turn (1980-nowadays)

By the end of twenty century, several events are on the basis of the political turn in Aesthetics and literary studies. As I already pointed out, I consider Michel Foucault one of the key thinkers, as a hinge, for understanding this turn, from the linguistic turn to the political turn, as other authors before (e.g. Roland Barthes as hinge between structuralism and post-structuralism). For this reason, I proposed to continue these concepts in connection with the ♦Literature and community relation♦. And I do that by two hypothesis:

- As for Jacques Rancière, many authors considers literature provides democratic models and processes of writing.
- Considering the conclusion of my first phase of working, we should be able to talk about the experience of literature. Experience of literature as E. Fischer-Lichte describes it for theatre.

I want to stress the special issue I am coordinating about ♦Politics of literature♦, for Prosopopeya, with some of the most important authors in this area: Jacques Rancière, Erika Fischer-Lichte, Jean-Luc Nancy or Judith Revel. And another I+D management activity, as part of my research project: ♦The International conference Politics of Aesthetics: thinking with Jacques Rancière".

**Resumen del Currículum Vitae:**

The profile of Azucena González Blanco, researcher fellow at the University of Granada, is highly competitive and international. She obtained her PhD in Theory of Literature and Comparative Literature at the University of Granada in 2000, after studying Hispanic Philology at the University of Córdoba (1996) and Philosophy at the UNED (2002). The continuous academic education stimulated her open and multi-disciplinary research, with a main focus on the various relations between literature and philosophy. Her international career is outstanding: since 2003, Azucena González Blanco was affiliated to renowned research centers in Europe and USA: Centre Michel Foucault (Paris), at the University of Irvine (USA), or recently, at Institute of World Literature at Harvard University, where she presented two works and has been selected for publication at the special issue of the Institute. It is specially highlighting her experience in research centers at Germany. In 2007, she worked at the Ibero-American Institute in Germany with the prestigious postdoctoral research fellowship of the institute. By the end of 2007 to 2009, she conducted research at the University of Potsdam with a postdoctoral contract and as lecturer. Since her return to Spain with a Juan de la Cierva fellowship in 2010, she was invited researcher affiliated to the bi-national doctoral program PhD-Net ♦Das Wissen der Literatur♦, collaborating with some of the most prestigious universities of the world: Harvard University, Princeton University, and University of California Berkeley. The competencies acquired from these outstanding experiences and her leadership qualities are reflected in her research management



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activities, such as the organization of international seminars and conferences in Germany and Spain: the ♦International Conference World Literature Today: literature, hermeneutics and translation♦ (U. Granada, 2014), with the participation of renowned thinkers, such as David Damrosch and Susan Bassnett; ♦Politics of Literature: thinking with Jacques Rancière♦ (U. Granada, 2014), with Jacques Rancière and Judith Revel; the international conference ♦The fertile thinking♦ with Julia Kristeva (Humboldt University, 2009), among others. For each of these activities she successfully acquired funding, among others from the German Research Foundation (DFG), the program ♦Das Wissen der Literatur♦, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), and the cooperation program ProSpanien. Her research has been published in various languages and countries, reflecting the international dimension of her research activities. Her curriculum vitae reveals a firm career as a lecturer, which she maintained and amplified by teaching for Comparative literature Grade, as well as, for Master Literary Studies and Theatre, Master of Contemporary Philosophy, and Doctorate in Theory of literature and Arts and Comparative literature. Likewise demonstrating her commitment to improving her leadership qualities and teaching skills in the future. Azucena González Blanco has been accepted for habilitation as assistant professor, private university professor and employed doctoral professor. Finally, the great potential of the candidate for leading a research group and managing an independent line of research is further supported by the award of the research project ♦Theory of literature and Aesthetics today: border aspects♦ with herself as head researcher.

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### Título:

Romance Dialectology and Geolinguistics

### Resumen de la Memoria:

The main research activity developed by the applicant falls under the field of Romance Dialectology and Geolinguistics. He has carried out very diverse tasks within this area, from methodological works and studies about Romance-speaking Europe as a whole to research on specific linguistic areas, especially the Western Iberian Peninsula, which has been examined both synchronically and diachronically. It must be highlighted that a significant part of these activities have been executed in the framework of international networks externally funded.

Within this research line, five strands of work can be identified:

#### 1) GALICIAN-PORTUGUESE LINGUISTIC ATLAS.

The candidate leads a team composed by researchers from the Universities of Lisboa and Santiago de Compostela aimed to produce an interpretative and commented Galician-Portuguese atlas which will examine 150 phonetic-phonological and morphological phenomena, as well as lexical designations, in a network of almost 300 points. This atlas is the first large-scale contrastive analysis between Galician and Portuguese, so it constitutes a very relevant contribution to the linguistic knowledge of the Western Peninsula.

#### 2) CRITICAL REVIEW OF REFERENCE WORKS IN PORTUGUESE DIALECTOLOGY.

The most widespread classifications of dialects and lexical areas in European Portuguese are those presented by Prof. Lindley Cintra in 1962 and 1971, based on his fieldwork for the **Atlas Lingüístico de la Península Ibérica** (ALPI). The candidate has checked the consistency of these classifications in two complimentary ways. On the one hand, he confronted them with a quantitative analysis of the unedited data of ALPI; on the other hand, he compared Cintra's data with more recent dialectal sources, in order to find diachronic variations. This contrast found many inconsistencies in the linguistic images depicted by Cintra.

#### 3) EXAMINATION OF MOTIVATIONS IN ROMANCE VOCABULARY.

This research work is closely linked to the candidate's activity in the **Atlas Linguistique Roman** (ALiR) since 2004. This international project, where about thirty European research institutions participate, aims to create a second-generation atlas that will provide an overall picture of the Romance-speaking area. It pays special attention to the classification and comment of lexical designations, which involves a deep work of lexicological analysis.

#### 4) IMPLEMENTATION OF GEOLINGUISTIC METHODS INTO PAREMIOLOGY.

This research topic falls within the project **ParemioRom: Paremiología romance y territorio**, at the University of Barcelona, funded by the Spanish Government (2012-2014). Its objective is the typological classification of proverbs and the exploration of their spatial distribution, in order to produce an **Atlas of Romance Proverbs**, which will mean a complete innovation in the state-of-the-art.

#### 5) METHODOLOGICAL PROPOSAL FOR THE STUDY OF LEXICAL FIELDS

This line proposes an integrated research model of dialectal data which combines: a) classification of the designations according to their motivation; b) cartographical representation and comment of the areal distribution; c) individual analysis of each form, taking into consideration the etymology, presence in dictionaries and literary works and existence of equivalents in neighbouring linguistic areas.

### Resumen del Currículum Vitae:

The candidate studied Romance Philology at the universities of Padua and Santiago de Compostela. In 2003, he obtained a BA degree in the latter, being awarded by the Ministry of Education because of his academic performance [**Primer Premio Nacional de Terminación de Estudios Universitarios**]. After the completion of a dissertation of romance medieval literature, he also obtained the Extraordinary Prize of Degree. He has also a BA in Galician Philology (2005).



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In 2003, he began his doctorate in Linguistics at the Instituto da Lingua Galega (Univ. of Santiago de Compostela), funded by a FPU fellowship awarded by the Spanish Government. During his PhD studies, he made a research visit at the University Stendhal-Grenoble 3. In April 2008, he defended his doctoral thesis, which received the *cum laude* distinction and the *Doctor Europaeus* mention. Since 2009, he is researcher at the Centro de Linguística da Universidade de Lisboa, funded by two postdoctoral fellowships awarded by Spanish and Portuguese governments.

Candidate's main scientific activity falls within the field of Romance Dialectology and Geolinguistics. Other topics addressed throughout his research and teaching career are Romance Linguistics, Historical Linguistics, Lexicology and Etymology, Lexicography and Multilingualism. He is actively involved in international research networks. He coordinates a collaborative project, jointly developed by the universities of Lisbon and Santiago de Compostela, aimed to produce a Galician-Portuguese contrastive and commented atlas. He is also member of the *Atlas Linguistique Roman* (since 2004), the *Dictionnaire Étymologique Roman* (since 2009), the *Tesouro do Léxico Patrimonial Galego e Português* (since 2010) and *Premio-Rom. Paremiología Romance: refranes meteorológicos y territorio* (since 2012).

With respect to the results of his scientific activity, the candidate authored a book and was co-editor of two monographs and one volume of proceedings. He coordinates a digital edition of onomastic materials and he is member of the research team of another two online corpora. Since 2005, he produced 50 contributions, already published or accepted, in indexed and peer-reviewed journals, chapters of books or proceedings. In this respect, it is worth mentioning his contribution to outstanding journals in his research field, such as *Dialectologia et Geolinguistica*, *Estudis Romànics*, *Journal of Portuguese Linguistics*, *Zeitschrift für romanische Philologie*, etc. Since the beginning of his career, he contributed to 27 conferences (10 of them, as guest-speaker) and was involved in the organisation of scientific meetings.

The candidate participated in management activities, as member of the Administration Board [*Consejo de Gobierno*] of the University of Santiago de Compostela (between 2006 and 2008). He is member of the Editorial Board of *Verba. Anuario Galego de Filoloxía* and has acted as referee for other journals. He collaborates with the ANEP as external evaluator for research projects. He was positively evaluated to be hired as *Prof. Contratado Doctor* in Spanish universities (ANECA, 2010) and as *Prof. Agregat* in Catalan universities (AQU, 2012); both of them, permanent positions.

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### Título:

Papirología griega. Estudio de la magia griega a través de las fuentes escritas

### Resumen de la Memoria:

Mi carrera de investigación se ha desarrollado de forma continua y reconocida por medio de becas y contratos de investigación de carácter competitivo desde 2002 hasta hoy. He estado vinculada y participando de forma activa en un total de 9 proyectos de investigación, uno de ellos de carácter internacional. En el marco de estos proyectos he dado a conocer los resultados de mis investigaciones en varias publicaciones científicas así como en congresos especializados nacionales e internacionales (vid. CV). Dentro de la línea general de los proyectos he tenido siempre la oportunidad de desarrollar de forma independiente mi propia línea de investigación.

Mi formación investigadora ha estado siempre vinculada a centros I+D de reconocido prestigio dentro de mi ámbito profesional tanto en España como en el extranjero. Mi perfil investigador en el campo de la Papirología y la Historia de la Religión Griega se ha desarrollado principalmente en España (CSIC y Universidad Complutense de Madrid) y en el extranjero (Chicago, Venecia, Columbus, Lecce, Leiden y Washington DC).

Mi línea de investigación está conformada por la sinergia de dos líneas principales de estudio, ambas relacionadas entre sí, y en múltiples ocasiones inseparables: el estudio de la religión y de la magia en el pensamiento griego, especialmente en época Greco-romana, y la papirología.

Desde mi estudio del Papiro de Derveni y otros documentos relacionados con el orfismo durante mis tesis doctoral, el estudio de los documentos griegos que aportan información directa sobre las creencias religiosas del pueblo griego, principalmente sobre religiones no cívicas, y sobre sus creencias en la magia, es la base principal de mi investigación científica.

De entre de los diversos tipos de documento que aportan dicha información, he centrado mi estudio en los textos en papiro. Los resultados científicos descritos en mi CV dan constancia de mi dedicación investigadora a este tipo de documentos escritos así como su importancia para la correcta interpretación de las creencias religiosas y mágicas en la Antigüedad. También dan constancia de mi relación con investigadores extranjeros con quienes colaboro activamente.

Mi trabajo en el proyecto DVCTVS, centrado en la recuperación del patrimonio papirológico nacional, ha sido clave para especializarme en esta disciplina auxiliar de la filología. La recuperación del patrimonio manuscrito papirológico en España es especialmente importante para el desarrollo de mi labor de investigación y tengo el privilegio de ser la responsable de la colección de papiros Ubach (Papyri Barcinonenses) sita en la Abadía de Montserrat.

Mi actual proyecto de investigación está en estrecha relación con mi línea global de investigación, y consiste en la re-edición, traducción y estudio sistemático de uno de los libros de magia mejor conservados en papiro, conservado en la British Library, y fechado en torno al s. IV d.C. Este proyecto ha sido apoyado por el Center for Hellenic Studies de la Universidad de Harvard que me concedió el año pasado una beca de investigación y que publicará los resultados del trabajo realizado durante este período.

Este proyecto de investigación pretende ser el punto de partida para la configuración de un proyecto de investigación más ambicioso que consistirá en el estudio de la transmisión del conocimiento mágico a través de libros.

### Resumen del Currículum Vitae:

Me doctoré en 2006 en Filología Griega por la UCM con una calificación de Sobresaliente cum Laude por unanimidad. En 2007 obtuve un contrato post-doctoral I3P en el CSIC, asociado al Instituto de Filología, de 3 años de duración. En 2010 me incorporé con un contrato de investigación Juan de la Cierva al Departamento de Filología Griega y Lingüística Indoeuropea de la Universidad Complutense de Madrid. Tras este contrato, que finalizó en Enero de 2013, obtuve un contrato de investigación en el Center for Hellenic Studies (Harvard) en Washington DC y tras su finalización en Enero de 2014 he sido contratada como profesora asociada de la Universidad Eclesiástica San Dámaso, donde en la actualidad realizo tareas docentes e investigadoras.

Durante mis años de trabajo en España he tenido la oportunidad de formarme en varias Universidades y Centros de Investigación del extranjero. La obtención de becas de movilidad de carácter competitivo de ámbito nacional e internacional ha contribuido en gran medida tanto al desarrollo de mi formación científica como a mi proyección internacional. Gracias a estas estancias he tenido la oportunidad de trabajar en centros de investigación internacionales que han resultado fundamentales para la consolidación de mis contactos profesionales con quienes sigo colaborando de forma activa. En 2008 y en 2009, durante el tiempo en que disfrutaba de un contrato de investigación I3P en el CSIC, obtuve sendas becas del programa José Castillejo para la movilidad de doctores en el extranjero. Durante dos años consecutivos realicé estancias de investigación de cinco meses en dos centros de investigación punteros en mi ámbito de estudio: el Center for Palaeographical and Epigraphical Studies de la Ohio State University, Columbus,



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Estados Unidos, y el Papyrologisch Instituut de la Universidad de Leiden, Países Bajos, centro este último en el que, además, pude seguir un curso avanzado de Papirología Griega.

En cuanto a mi producción científica soy autora de 1 monografía y de dos traducciones al castellano de obras griegas con introducción y notas (una de ellas en prensa, prevista publicación 2014). Soy editora de tres obras colectivas, dos de ellas publicadas en la editorial alemana De Gruyter. Soy autora de 25 capítulos de libro en obras colectivas de carácter nacional e internacional, y de 9 artículos científicos publicados mayoritariamente en revistas indexadas y con revisión por pares.

He participado de forma activa en un total de 39 congresos, 12 de ellos internacionales, en los que he presentado los resultados de mis investigaciones a la comunidad científica.

En cuanto a mi labor docente he impartido cursos tanto en grado como en máster. Mi docencia siempre ha estado vinculada a mi campo de estudio. Por otra parte, he dirigido dos trabajos de fin de máster, ambos calificados con sobresaliente.

He organizado varios congresos, jornadas, y seminarios, así como cursos de especialización tanto en el CSIC como en la UCM. De entre ellos cabe destacar la organización del IX y X Congreso de la SECR, sociedad de la que soy secretaria, y la organización de los seminarios de papirología, este último año en la UCM, docencia reconocida con 1.5 créditos ECTS por parte de la universidad.

Por último destacar mi labor como secretaria de la colección DVCTVS del CSIC, colección especializada en la edición de textos manuscritos.





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### Título:

Lexical and syntactic processing in monolingual and bilinguals: An experimental approach

### Resumen de la Memoria:

During my research career I have acquired a strong and solid background in linguistics and more specifically, psycholinguistics. Additionally I have a good training in experimental methodology, including the ability to design behavioural and electrophysiological (Event-Related Potential; ERP) experiments. I have conducted and been directly involved in several research projects focusing on the processes of language production and comprehension in monolinguals and bilinguals. Specifically, I have developed two main research lines in which I have studied (1) lexical representation and selection processes in bilingual speakers, and (2) representation and processing of syntax in both monolinguals and bilinguals. Regarding the first topic, my research has showed that high-proficient bilinguals rely on different language control mechanisms than low-proficient bilinguals during speech production. Regarding the second topic, I have mainly focused on the processing of agreement relations in language production and comprehension. To this end, I have considered the so-called agreement attraction phenomenon, whereby the presence of more than one possible agreement candidate - such as key and cabinets in sentences The key to the cabinets - may lead speakers to produce agreement errors like The key to the cabinets \*are, or hamper listeners' ability to detect such ungrammaticalities (Bock & Miller, 1991; Nicol, Forster, & Veres, 1997). I have investigated this phenomenon by registering both behavioural and electrophysiological responses of monolingual and bilingual participants. My research has showed that number attraction effects similarly disrupt the production and comprehension of different types of agreement relations (subject-verb and object-verb agreement in Basque; and subject-verb and object-clitic agreement in Spanish). Moreover, this line of research has provided a cross-linguistic characterization of agreement encoding processes, with results suggesting that the encoding of object-verb agreement relations in Basque and the encoding of object-clitic agreement relations with their antecedents in Spanish are governed by the same principles as subject-verb agreement relations. In sum, my research has provided important evidence that will allow researchers to better understand the processes involved in agreement encoding, and linguists and psycholinguists to improve their models of language processing. However, further research is needed to provide a broad cross-linguistic characterization of agreement processing.

### Resumen del Currículum Vitae:

During my research career, I have mainly worked in the research field of linguistics and, more specifically, psycholinguistics. In 1999, I enrolled in a Linguistics Ph.D program at the University of the Basque Country. In 2000, I was awarded a research collaboration grant to work at the Cognitive Neuroscience Research Group headed by Prof. Sebastián-Gallés at the Universitat de Barcelona. There I was familiarized with research methods and topics related to the group's interests, such as the processes involved in the perception and production of language by newborns, adults, and neuropsychological patients, with special emphasis on bilingualism.

In 2001, I enrolled in the Cognitive Science and Language Ph.D. program at the Universitat de Barcelona under the supervision of Dr. Costa. I designed and carried out experimental research in language production with monolinguals and bilinguals, focusing on the processes of lexical access and sentence production. At the time, I focused my research on the study of bilingual speakers' language selection mechanisms during speech production. The results of this research were the core of my Ph.D thesis entitled Lexical representation and selection in bilingual speech production, that I defended in 2006, having Dr. Costa as supervisor.

Between 2006 and 2009 I worked as a post-doctoral researcher with Prof. Pickering at the University of Edinburgh (UK) and was awarded a post-doctoral fellowship from the Spanish Government as well as a Marie Curie Intra-European Fellowship from the European Union. There I conducted several series of experiments in which I investigated two main topics: (i) the encoding of agreement and (ii) the processes of selection of syntactic structures in speech production. During my collaboration with Prof. Pickering, I learnt how to design and run experiments to investigate different processes of sentence production using agreement error elicitation tasks (i.e., sentence completion tasks) and syntactic priming tasks (i.e., priming techniques). I also acquired new statistical analysis skills: mixed effects analyses with R. This collaboration so far has resulted in three journal papers, while additional papers are currently submitted and in preparation.

From 2010 until now I have been working as a Juan de la Cierva researcher (2010-2012) and as a Research Fellow (2013-now) at The Bilingual Mind group led by Prof. Laka. There I have established myself as an independent researcher: I lead a research project exploring the processes of agreement encoding (financed by the Spanish Government and the European Commission) and I have collaborated in the development of research lines, such as the impact of argument alignment (ergativity/nominativity) and word order processing differences in Basque-Spanish bilinguals.

In sum, during my research career I have conducted and been directly involved in several research projects, and I have acquired a



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strong and solid background in psycholinguistics as well as good training in experimental methodology. Importantly, I have presented the results of my research at several national and international conferences, and most of this work is already published in ISI journals: Journal of Memory and Language; Bilingualism; Brain and Language; Trends in Cognitive Science; Journal of Experimental Psychology: LMC; Language and Cognitive Processes (see CV).
