Legal protection of migrants and integration processes in comparative perspective

Resumen de la Memoria:

Since I began my research career in 2006, my main research fields have been those of human rights, migration, transnational families, diversity, comparative law, the legal and political implications of integration processes, the reception and protection of asylum seekers, the resolution and management of diversity-related conflicts in plural societies and the identification of situations of vulnerability and complex inequality, paying special attention to the methodological perspective of human rights research. My proposed project is entitled "Legal protection of migrants and integration processes in comparative perspective". If selected, it will be appropriately carried out at the University of Valencia Human Rights Institute led by Professor Javier de Lucas, a leading national and international expert in the field of immigration and human rights.

The quality of my overall scientific production is testified by a high number of publications during the last years, including monographs and book chapters as well as many articles in ranked national and international journals. On the one hand, the monographs and book chapters have been published in nationally and internationally renowned houses. They include a monograph of which I am the main author, another I have co-authored, as well as the co-edition of a collective book and 26 book chapters. On the other hand, I have published over 30 articles in renowned and ranked national and international journals in the area of legal philosophy, human rights and migration, in different languages (Spanish, French, English and Italian).

My CV demonstrates a capacity to secure research funds in highly competitive calls at the national and European level: FPU programme; Programa de formación postdoctoral Vali+d (Valencian Government); Fernand Braudel-IFER incoming (Fondation Maison Science de l'Homme and European Commission); Juan de la Cierva post-doctoral scholarships. I have participated as a researcher in 7 projects within the National R&D Plan, including a CONSOLIDER project, in two European projects and two other competitive projects, one of them as main investigator.

With respect to international mobility and transfer of results, I have participated in more than 78 international and national conferences. My contributions include several invited presentations and various communications in national conferences organised by the University of Zaragoza, Rovira i Virgili University, University of Alcalá, University of Valencia, Carlos III University, University of La Rioja, University of the Basque Country and international centres such as the University of Milan, Paris Sorbonne University, New University of Lisboa, University of Ghent, University of Oxford, Birkbeck University of London, University of Nantes and Aix-Marseille University. As part of my doctoral and post-doctoral training, I have been a visiting academic at several prestigious national and international centres.

Along with these research activities, I have taken part in continuing teaching and important institutional collaborations, such as with the European Commission Directorate General of Immigration and Home Affairs (Department of immigration and integration). I am a reviewer and secretary for specialised journals and I have organised national and international conferences as well as sat on the juries of awards and master's and do

Over the last decade, I have conducted academic activities as FPU researcher at the University of Valencia (2006-2010) and in the framework of three competitive, internationally renowned post-doctoral scholarships: Vali+d GVA at Paris Ovest La Défense University (2011-2013), Fernand Braudel-IFER incoming/Marie Curie COFUND at Aix Marseille University (2014-2015) and Juan de la Cierva MINECO at the University of Deusto (2015-2017).

My main fields of research are related to human rights, diversity and the legal protection of migrants in the European Union from a comparative perspective. I have published two monographs, co-edited a collective volume and authored over 30 articles in ranked journals of national and international renown in various languages (Spanish, English, Italian and French), together with numerous chapters, translations and reviews. I am deputy secretary of the Anuario de Filosofía del Derecho and the Revista Deusto de Derechos Humanos, as well as external reviewer for several specialised journals in the field of legal philosophy and migration.

I have participated as researcher in 11 competitive projects, including 7 funded by the Spanish National R&D Plan (one of these as part of the CONSOLIDER INGENIO programme) and 2 by the European Commission (Labexmed-Amorce and Jean Monnet programmes). I am

Derecho Penal, Ciencia e Innovación Tecnológica / Criminal Law, Science and Technological Innovation

Resumen de la Memoria:

Emilio José ARMAZA-ARMAZA has focused his efforts in studying the implications of scientific development and technological innovation manifestations in the sphere of Criminal Law (analysis from the perspective of Criminal Law Theory and Criminal Policy).

The activity was developed, fundamentally, from the point of view of Spanish law, as well as European and international law, given that the researcher intends to offer a global vision (multilevel) of the issues dealt with. The research line has been achieved through the development of a set of distinct lines of work that have been progressively updated and extended from a multidisciplinary perspective. The central axes of the researcher's work have been: a) The criminal treatment of the dangerous offenders. b) The new legal and technological instruments for combating economic crime. c) Law responses to new manifestations of human enhancement in sport. d) Problems that crises and biological emergencies pose for Criminal Law. e) Problems that a set of specific and novel technologies pose to Criminal Law and Biolaw.

The trajectory of the candidate has been developed over a decade (2006-2017) of intense production and scientific dissemination. Since joining the "Chair in Law and the Human Genome" (worldwide reference, particularly in Europe and Latin America, within the Biolaw field), he has participated in a numerous amount of activities and actions of research, dissemination and training of researchers. He has led and coordinated the execution of several of these activities (Project, Seminars, Thesis Direction or Master's and Degree Projects, Publications, Direction of stays for visiting researchers). His participation in international activities has resulted in the implementation of a vast number of international research projects (funded by the European Commission), as well as international mobility actions (in Europe, Latin America and even in Asia). He has an accredited capacity for obtaining resources (he is a "Principal Researcher", as well as a Member, of several Projects; he has been the beneficiary of several scholarships for research or national and international mobility). His scientific contributions have been disseminated in dozens of publications (75), as well as in numerous lectures and presentations given at national and international Congresses and Seminars (62). The researcher maintains numerous collaborations with European entities (Council of Europe and European Commission), private international institutions and with European and Latin American academic centres. He has led and coordinated various actions for the transfer of knowledge to society, companies and organizations, and has produced numerous reports for public bodies (European Commission, MINECO, Governing Bodies, University). He participates in several actions to evaluate activity and scientific production as a member of Committees or Commissions designated for this purpose. In recognition of his career and scientific production he has received several recognitions and distinctions (among them the appointment as "Honorary Professor of University").

Emilio José ARMAZA-ARMAZA (1982), Graduated in Law (Catholic University of Santa María, 2005 -Degree Approved by the Ministry of Education of Spain-) and Doctor of Law (University of the Basque Country, 2011, Outstanding Cum Laude, unanimously). Accredited as "Profesor Adjunto" (Social, Legal and Economic Sciences) by the "Agency for the Quality of the Basque University System" (UNIBASQ).

He has carried out 10 years of scientific activity, specifically, in the "Chair in Law and the Human Genome" (2006-2016). Throughout this period he has obtained the results that make him eligible to obtain the recognition of "6 years of research activity" (sexenio) that has not been recognized due to his "non-permanent researcher" staff status. He has been FPI Fellow of the Spanish Ministry of Economy, Industry and Competitiveness (MINECO) and of the Spanish Ministry of Health. He has performed research stays abroad: At the University of the Basque Country (Bilbao, 2006-2010), at the National Academy of Law Sciences of Ukraine (Kiev, March-April 2013), at the University of Coimbra (Coimbra, July-September 2015) and at the Catholic University of Santa María (Peru, different periods).

He is author of 6 books, 33 book chapters and 24 articles in journals (some of them indexed in the most important scientific databases). He is Coordinator/Editor of 5 books. Is, also, Principal Researcher of 1 National Research Project, and a member of other 12 Projects (6 of them European). He has participated in more than 60 Congresses/Meetings of Experts (in Spain, Europe, Asia and Latin America). He has been Director of Final Degree Projects and Doctoral and Master Thesis (in progress) and he has supervised the stays or research activities of several foreign and Spanish researchers. He has organized 37 Congresses and Seminars (Nationals and Internationals). He also has produced several reports for public institutions (European Commission, MINECO). As a member of the "Ethics Committee of Animal Experimentation" at the University of the Basque Country, he has evaluated the ethical and legal aspects of more than a hundred Research Projects carried out at that university.
